It is always a good idea to call first.</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> brush tree trimmings weeds plants/flowers grass clippings stumps branches No plastic bags or pottery <p>→ NOTE: Curbside brush pick-up is Tuesday & Friday (Oct –Mar) Friday only (Apr-Sep)</p> <p>Metal Pile: Area just behind the trash compactor</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> steel chairs aluminum chairs metal shelving electrical conduit aluminum gutters & downspouts metal fencing metal cabinets 	<p>Hazardous Waste:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> used oil (tank available) fluorescent light bulbs used paint (with liquid contents) solvents aerosol cans (with contents) <p>Aluminum Can Crusher: Two locations: One at HW, the other adjacent to recycling container.</p> <p>→ NOTE: You are not required to crush the can yourself. We have volunteers that will do it for you. No plastic bags!</p>

Not acceptable in any containers: Furniture, White Goods & Appliances, Truck & Car Tires, Automobile and Golf Cart Batteries, Electronic Waste, Hazardous Waste

UNACCEPTABLE TRASH AT CAREFREE DISPOSAL STATION

PRODUCT	COMMENT
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Auto/Golf Cart Batteries 	Leave old battery with dealer or garage when changed ***
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Car and Truck Tires 	Arrange for dealer or garage to keep old tires after replacement ***
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Furniture (i.e. sofas, chairs, tables, beds, mattresses/box springs) 	If in good condition refer to the <i>Alternate Disposal Options Section</i> . If not usable, ask furniture vendor to remove when new furniture is delivered ***
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> White Goods, (i.e. stove, refrigerators, washer, dryer) 	If in good condition refer to the <i>Alternative Disposal Options Section</i> . If not useable, ask the appliance vendor to remove when new appliances are delivered ***

***** If vendor will not remove the product, then it is your responsibility to find someone that can help you dispose of it and transport it out of Carefree to a Licensed Disposal Facility at your expense.**



HAZARDOUS WASTE AT CAREFREE

PRODUCT	COMMENTS
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Electronic Waste (TV, computers, printers, microwave, DVR, DVD, Radio) 	If in working conditions check Alternative Disposal Options Section. If not working, take to Hazardous Waste area.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Batteries (small batteries, AA, AAA, C, D), Rechargeable only 	Take to Hazardous Waste Area
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Used Oil 	There is a barrel at HW for used oil
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Used Paint 	If paint container still has fluid paint, take to HW, if paint container is dry or solid take to the trash container
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Solvents, Insecticides, Pesticides 	Take to HW, please make sure lids are closed tight
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Fluorescent light bulbs 	Take to HW, if more than one, tape together
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Golf Cart Tires 	Take to C&D open top
